SECTION 2 HAZARD IDENTIFICATION

SECTION 4 FIRST AID MEASURES

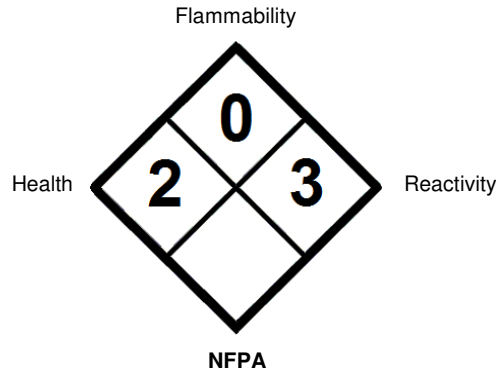
