## SECTION 2 HAZARD IDENTIFICATION

**SECTION 4 FIRST AID MEASURES**

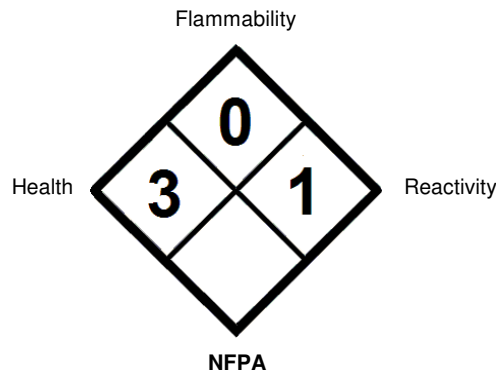
